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Justification

In Mexico, pediatric cancer is the main cause of death in children between 5-14 years of age. A global 5-year survival is estimated to be between 30-40%, while in the United States it is higher than 80%.

In Mexico there are few pediatric oncologists and hematologists. It is estimated that there are approximately 1.07 per 100,000 inhabitants, while in the United States it is 3.75 per 100,000 inhabitants.

Out of these specialists in Mexico, 44% are concentrated in Mexico City and 18% between Guadalajara and Monterrey. Oaxaca is the 3rd state with the highest incidence of cancer in children under 20.

The purpose of this seminar is to raise awareness among first-contact physicians and pediatricians about the epidemiology of pediatric cancer in Mexico, as well as to identify the signs of alarm to achieve early diagnoses and timely referrals to specialists. Also, to put into perspective the need of specialists in Mexico to treat these pathologies, and the importance of a multidisciplinary team for the better management of these patients.







After the workshop, all the participants met again in the main Zoom session for final comments and to conclude the academic program.











Being 10 de highest score, how would you rate the webinar "Pediatric Hemato-Oncology 2020?

- Gastroenterology
- Malnutrition, Constipation and Reflux
- Diarrhea
- Continue with Pediatric Cancer and Pediatric Hematology
- Management of the Hemato-oncological patient or Emergencies in the Hemato-oncological patient.
- Pediatric Psychology
- Covid-19 in children
- Infections transmitted by vectors, parasites (e.g. Chagas disease, Lehismaniasis that we have had in the hospital, dengue)
- Perinatally transmitted infections (CMV, HIV, EB, etc.)
- · Neonatal hypoglycemia
- Congenital and acquired cataracts
- Meconium aspiration Sx
- TPN in the neonate
- Mechanical ventilation in the NB
- Non-invasive ventilation
- Central venous access

What are the greatest needs in your hospital?

- Lack of medications
- Interest on the part of pediatric doctors
- Lack of chemotherapies, antibiotics, medical equipment, food for patients as support during their stay to receive treatment.
- Lack of staff in oncology
- Lack of medical supplies
- Lack of trained personnel
- We do not have a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit or a good nursery space.
- Lack of a good laboratory, our diagnoses are affected and are delayed awaiting results that are sent to other units.
- Lack of specialists and medical supplies and equipment to treat patients.

Do you think this new modality of online courses works and is sustainable?

- Sure, it does! It works and shortens distances, costs and medical permits.
- I think so. The speakers are excellent and you can tell that they prepare themselves very
 well to share all the information about their topic. The workshop was very good. The
 course is an excellent tool for first contact physicians, perhaps aimed at general
 practitioners, pediatric physicians, and nurses. I hope you continue offering this course.
- Yes, it is much more accessible.
- It works, I think it is an excellent option.
